

Bequest Language

A charitable bequest is one of the easiest ways to leave a lasting legacy to Family & Children's Place. A bequest can be a provision when you write your will or added as a codicil after the fact. Following is language you can use for a bequest. Contact your estate planner for his or her professional advice.

A specific bequest:

*I hereby give, devise, and bequeath to **Family & Children's Place** the sum of \$_____ or the property described as _____*

A residual bequest (assets remaining after all other specific bequests have been satisfied):

*I hereby give, devise, and bequeath to **Family & Children's Place** the rest, remainder, and residue of my estate, or _____ % (or fractional interest) of the rest, remainder, and residue of my estate.*

A contingent bequest (takes effect only if those named as primary beneficiaries predecease you):

*If any or all of the above named beneficiaries do not survive me, then I hereby give the share that otherwise would be (his/hers/theirs) to **Family & Children's Place** charitable organization.*

A general bequest:

*I hereby give, devise, and bequeath to **Family & Children's Place** the sum of \$_____, or _____ %, or _____ fractional interest of my estate.*

Designations: (for a specific project, program, or use)

*It is my desire and instruction this bequest to **Family & Children's Place** be used for the following _____*
